## SSR RESPONSE LOG TOPICS

**Character** - Give proof from the reading that shows what type of person the character is. Do not focus on physical attributes. Focus on personalities. Consider major and minor characters, antagonists and protagonists. Describe the character and give an example from the text that proves you are right.

**Setting, Conflict, Literary Analysis** - Choose one area for the response; do not try to write about all three. **For setting:** describe the setting of the book, including both time and place. Make a connection. Is this place realistic? Why do you think the author chose to place this story in this setting? How would the story be different if the setting was different? **For conflict:** explain one of the conflicts in the book. Is it internal or external? Identify the antagonist and the protagonist. Is the conflict believable? How does it drive the plot of the book? **For literary analysis:** make a prediction about what is going to happen, or describe something you are wondering about. Either way, you must explain WHY you think the way you do. Explain why you think something is going to happen, or give a possible answer to your question.

**Text Response** - Find a phrase or sentence in the text that means something to you. Quote the text on your reading log and explain what this means to you. Why do you like this? What does it make you think of? How is it important to the story?
